



 VOCABULARY CHALLENGE**

Booker T. Washington dreamed of getting an education. To be successful he needed to make good choices, work hard, and save for the future. Having knowledge of economic concepts is valuable when striving to achieve a goal.

Your goal is to match an economic concept with the correct definition. You are to find the person who has the matching half to your card as quickly as possible. The hints provided will help you make sure your match is correct. Be prepared to share your concept and definition with the class.

**ECONOMIC
 CONCEPT**

DEFINITION

Human Resources (matches with a 7-word definition)	People working to produce goods and services (Matches with 2-word concept; the first word has 5 letters)
Bartering (matches with a 9-word definition)	Exchanging goods and services without the use of money (matches with a 9-letter word)
Capital Resources (matches with a 12-word definition)	Goods made by people and used to produce other goods and services (matches with a 2-word concept; the second word has 9 letters)
Consumer (matches with a 8-word definition)	Person who uses or buys goods and services (matches with an 8-letter word)
Goods (matches with a 10-word definition)	Things people make or use to satisfy needs and wants (matches with a 5-letter word)
Money (matches with a 9-word definition)	Anything commonly accepted in exchange for goods and services (matches with a 5-letter word)
Natural Resources (matches with a 6-word definition)	Materials that come directly from nature (matches with a 2-word concept; the first word has 7 letters)
Opportunity Cost (matches with a 13-word definition)	The next best choice, one that is given up when a decision is made (matches with a 2-word concept; the second word has 4 letters)
Producer (matches with a 12-word definition)	A person who uses resources to make goods and/or provide services (matches with an 8-letter word)
Savings (matches with a 2-sentence definition)	Money not spent now so it can be spent in the future. People save to buy something later when they have enough money. (matches with a 7-letter word)
Services (matches with a 7-word definition)	Activities that satisfy people's needs and wants (matches with an 8-letter word)
Specialization (matches with a 12-word definition)	A focus on the production of selected kinds of goods and services (matches with a 14-letter word)
Wants (matches with a 15-word definition)	Things people would like to have; includes basic needs such as food, clothing, and shelter (matches with a 5-letter word)

ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

ART

Brian Collier illustrates his books using collage, an artistic composition created by combining miscellaneous materials together on a canvas. Give students scrap paper, old magazines, scissors, and glue, and encourage them to create a collage of their own depicting a scene from a favorite book.

GEOGRAPHY

In 1872, young Booker T. Washington walked 500 miles from Malden, West Virginia, to Hampton, Virginia. Display a map of the United States and have the students decide what route he could have taken and what geographical obstacles he may have faced.

QUOTATIONS

Booker T. Washington is known for his wisdom, work ethic, and amicable nature. Share the following quotations with the students and discuss their possible meaning:

1. "Associate yourself with people of good quality, for it is better to be alone than in bad company."
2. "Character is power."
3. "Excellence is to do a common thing in an uncommon way."
4. "I shall allow no man to belittle my soul by making me hate him."
5. "If you can't read, it's going to be hard to realize dreams."
6. "If you want to lift yourself up, lift up someone else."
7. "Success is to be measured not so much by the position that one has reached in life as by the obstacles which he has overcome."
8. "There are two ways of exerting one's strength: one is pushing down, the other is pulling up."
9. "We should not permit our grievances to overshadow our opportunities."
10. "You can't hold a man down without staying down with him."
