Defining Primary and Secondary Sources

Primary Sources

- Firsthand accounts concerning personal experiences or observations
- Official records and legal documents

Examples

- birth certificates
- diaries and journals
- eyewitness accounts
- autobiographies
- legal documents
- interviews
- last will and testament
- letters (including e-mail)
- photographs

Secondary Sources

- Materials written after the fact

Examples

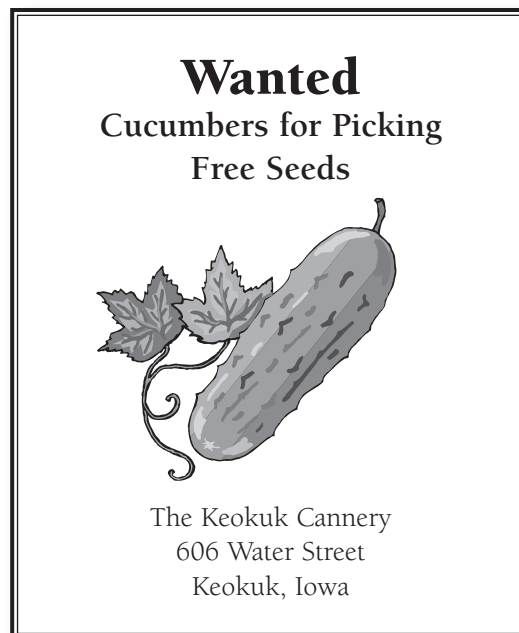
- encyclopedias
